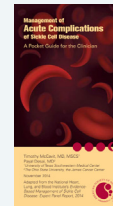

SCD Toolbox

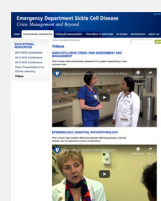
The Toolbox includes the most recent protocols, algorithms for most common complications, and gives users the ability to contact a regional specialist by video-chat or email.

A national group of healthcare professionals working in adult sickle cell disease. The website allows for participants to post questions and obtain specific feedback.



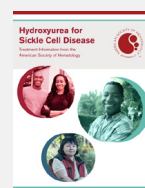
